Plans for Spending

The Podesta Ranch Leadership Team met to discuss supplemental programs intended to enrich student learning and deepen their connection to our school community that link to the Arts (Art, Music, STEAM, Sciences). Of our 100% allocation, planned expenditures are \$53,268 to salary budget and \$13,317 to non-salary budget, totaling our expected allocation of \$66,585.

Supplemental materials such as:

- sheet music and Instruments/ supplies for band, strings, choir
- STEAM materials, manipulatives, and equipment to deepen student's exploration and learning
- Technology, art applications, Printing devices, Paper and art supplies

Staffing Expenditures include:

Principal will allocate funds to pay certificated and classified staff to work outside of contract time to provide instruction and enrichment in the areas listed above. Funds may also be used for teachers to engage in professional development and collaboration related to the arts, and to bring in outside contractors to facilitate activities related to the arts for our students. Specifically, our student learning opportunities will be centered around Music (strings/band/ choir), STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math), Art History, and Graphic Design.
